## **THE 2020 PREMIER'S READING CHALLENGE**

**HOW DID THEY DO IT? BY READING LOTS OF BOOKS!**

### **K, Years 1 & 2**

Read 30 books from the PRC list for their level. An adult or sibling can read with them or to them.

What they read in class or Library lessons ALL COUNT.

Books in our Libraries have red stickers that say **K/2** level. They can borrow 2 books a week and change them in Library lesson time.

### **Years 3 & 4**

Read 20 books from the PRC list for their level.

Books in our school Libraries will have green stickers that say **3/4** level.

You can borrow 2-3 books a week and change them in your Library lesson.

### **Years 5 & 6**

Read 20 books from the PRC list for their level.

Books in our school Libraries purple stickers that say **5/6** level.

You can borrow 2-3 books a week and change them in your Library lesson.

Premiers Reading Challenge (PRC) is a program to encourage children to read and enjoy a variety of quality stories. Successful completion of the challenge is rewarded with a Certificate signed by the Premier of NSW and recognition is given to students who participate regularly – a gold certificate is awarded following participation for 4 years and participation for 7 years, K-6 receives a platinum certificate. Participation often drops off in the higher grades and this year we would love to have more than 180 students complete PRC and would also like to see more Year 5 & 6 students showing leadership and participating.

The reading is to be done mostly at home and the recording done at home by the student or parent. We help students achieve their goal to complete by having eligible books marked and displayed prominently in the library. Students participating in the challenge are highlighted in our loans system and we encourage them to borrow eligible books for their level. However, parents must communicate to their child that they are participating. Encouragement is given to students in Library lessons and older students are shown how to record their own reading online. Books read to children in class (K-2 only) are also eligible and we automatically add these books to student records. The challenge allows books from 1 September 2019 to be included and we have a borrowing history which can be accessed to help out. Recognition is given to students during the challenge with prizes given for first completed, most completed students in a class, Lucky draw with all completed students having a chance to win and the newsletter and our library page publishes a list of students who have completed the challenge. Last year all Gold and Platinum Certificate attended a special celebration party.

A separate PRC newsletter is also published for families who participate offering tips and support. If you think this is something you and your child might like to participate in, please fill in the form on the back and sent it back to school ASAP and start your reading now.
